A 2. Waltz

This musical score system includes parts for Flute, Violin I, Violin II, Basso, and Harp. The key signature is one sharp (F#) and the time signature is 3/8. The Flute part begins with a forte (*f*) dynamic and features a melodic line with eighth notes and slurs. The Violin I and II parts provide harmonic support with similar rhythmic patterns.
